

Oxfordshire Anti-Bullying Charter

Our school:.....

1. Understands

All school staff, pupils and parents and carers understand what bullying is and what it isn't.

2. Believes

All pupils, and their parents and carers, are acknowledged, believed and taken seriously when reporting incidents of bullying.

3. Listens

All pupils and parents and carers are listened to and influence strategies to prevent, report and respond to incidents of bullying.

4. Takes action

We respond quickly to all incidents of bullying whether they take place on or offline. Pupils participate fully in decisions made about them and help to formulate appropriate action to respond to incidents of bullying.

5. Reports bullying

All pupils within the school and their parents and carers understand how to report incidents of bullying, including cyberbullying.

6. Includes us all

All pupils are included, valued and participate fully in all aspects of school life.

7. Challenges

All forms of discriminatory language are challenged and taken seriously.

8. Celebrates difference

Difference is actively and visibly celebrated and welcome across the whole school. It is acknowledged that the school community includes disabled people, people of different races, ages, faiths, backgrounds and people who will be LGBT.

9. Respects

All school staff are role models to others within the school in how they treat others.

10. Has clear policies

Our school Anti-Bullying policy reflects these principles and is embedded within other school policies. They are widely and actively promoted to school staff and their parents and carers.
