Oxfordshire Young Carers Service has identified and supported over 2600 children and young adults (aged 0-25 years) who provide unpaid care to a family member. Young Carers within the county, and nationally are more likely to have mental health problems, poorer school attendance than average and are more likely to be identified as having poor educational attainment and not be Not in Education, Employment or Training, along with being at greater risk of child exploitation. The session will address the particular needs of young carers and how you can support them to reach their full potential
