Disadvantage

"Oxfordshire County Council recognises that it needs to reflect and reset ways of working between the Council and schools in the best interests of all children, particularly the most disadvantaged. " (The Education Commission Report Sept 2023)

Governors and trustees are expected to: "consider how the school is going to raise standards for all children[including]... those receiving free school meals and those who are more broadly disadvantaged" <u>The Governance Handbook</u>

Chairing the governing board

The autumn term is a time of change for many governing boards.

As a reminder, here are the regulations with regard to the appointment of chair and vice chair. It is for the board to elect a chair and vice chair from among their number.

From <u>The School Governance (Roles, Procedures and Allowances) (England)</u> <u>Regulations 2013 (legislation.gov.uk)</u>:

Election of the chair and vice-chair

7.—(1) Subject to section 67 of the EIA 2006 (power of Secretary of State to appoint additional governors), the governing body **must** elect a chair and a vice-chair from among their number.

6) Where a vacancy arises in the office of the chair or vice-chair, the governing body **must** elect one of their number to fill that vacancy at their next meeting.

(7) Where the chair is absent from any meeting or there is at the time a vacancy in the office of the chair, the vice-chair is to act as chair for all purposes.

If governors do not feel that they have sufficient experience to become chair, please do be reassured that we are here to support you – there are many resources on GovernorHub, and there is our advice line, both phone and email.
