
Oxfordshire Covid Data

Oxfordshire Covid Cases (Coronavirus in the UK)

Cases in Oxfordshire | Coronavirus in the UK (data.gov.uk)

The 7-day rolling average rate of daily positive Covid-19 cases per 100,000 was **7.7** on the 24 November 2023.

This has decreased from the previously reported rate of **10.2** per 100,000 two weeks previously.

Multiply Funding update

For school and education setting leaders 5th December 2023





What funding is available?

- £100,000 has been secured for schools and education settings until March 2024.
- Applications should be made for a minimum or £1,000 and a maximum of £5,000 and should be targeted at the following areas.
 - Learning opportunities for parents wanting to increase their numeracy skills to help their children and help with their own progression.
 - Learning opportunities designed to help people use numeracy to manage their money.









What is eligible?

- Parents and carers who are over 19 years old and reside in Oxfordshire
- Learning must be designed to increase parent and carer numeracy skills to help their children with their own progression, and to help people with managing their money.
- Learning must be a maximum of 2 hours in total for each person and/or cohort.
- Must be delivered by 31st March 2024.

Theme	Example
Staffing	 Up 2 hours of a teacher, teaching assistant or specialist to deliver the intervention. Apportioned staff time to plan, administer and set up the engagement event(s). Apportioned staff time to complete monitoring and evaluation returns.
Resource s	 Stationary that will be used to support the learning event. Books and other reasonable resources including on-line. Specialist providers to support delivery Laptop and/or tablet devices to deliver the engagement sessions (for larger cohorts) Software subscriptions
Incentives	 Food vouchers for a nominal sum. Numeracy related merchandise such as calculators.


