What Are Smokefree School Gates?

- Aim: to work with our schools and Early Years settings to create a smokefree environment when dropping off or collecting children.
- Make school gates and the immediate area around the school a voluntary smokefree zone
- Sends a positive message to children and communities that health and wellbeing are a priority
- Visual signs that have a positive message at school gates/entrances
- Smokefree policy implemented at school site



Why Become a Smokefree School?



- Reduce smoking uptake in children and young people by...
- >denormalising smoking to prevent children copying adults/parents
- Supporting parents who smoke to quit children of smokers 3 x more likely to start and 70% of people start smoking before they are 18
- Improve air quality and health and wellbeing in Oxfordshire
- Build on the support from local communities for smokefree school gates. 91% of 300 smokers surveyed agreed with this initiative.

Smokefree Gates at Wood Farm

- Worked with Public Health to create own smokefree gate policy
- Policy writing linking to the school community and needs
- Support from Governors and staff
- Communication with parents
- Linking to the Relationships and Health (RSE) statutory outcomes (Pupils should know: The facts about legal and illegal harmful substances and associated risks, including smoking, alcohol use and drug-taking)
- Involving children in the learning and designing
- Not policing or challenging
- Feedback

 - Free Very Brief Advice training
 - Increase confidence in having conversations about smoking without getting into conflict
 - Importance of talking about smoking
 - ➢Give the best advice about quitting
