LCSS will continue to work with all partners to support Early Help in the community and we are excited to continue our support across the localities supporting partners and families where emerging need arises.



CELEBRATE – increase in Early Help approach across Oxfordshire:

Last year 23/24 saw 5732 completed Strengths and Needs and 5682 completed social care assessments so now families are more likely to receive Early Help approach than a statutory intervention.

This is brilliant for children who are more likely to receive help earlier for emerging need. Thank you for all your hard work in this area across the partnership.

## King Alfreds Wellbeing parents Evening July 24

King Alfreds organised and hosted a wellbeing event for parents. The idea came after a community around the school offer (CASO) meeting took place which LCSS lead. The wellbeing event was an action from the CASO to provide parents with information about local services and support available for their children in the area. Around 40 parents attended.

The Locality and Community Support Service (LCSS), Mental health support team (MHST), Targeted youth support service, Cranston, Sweatbox, School counsellor and senior leaders for King Alfreds all had stalls for parents to visit and find out their information.

LCSS and MHST gave short presentations about their Early Help and their services and how this can support children and families. LCSS were able to inform parents about what Early help is and the Strengths & needs and Team around the family process.

Parents were keen to chat to services and felt empowered hearing about what is available and how they can access them. LCSS had a number of conversations with parents and about Early help and provided advice and signposting. The event was really positive and a model a lot of schools could adopt to increase parents' awareness of services and support for their children/family to bring about positive change.



## COMMUNITY PARENTING SUPPORT:

Thank you to all those who completed the Parenting Support Survey which was circulated in the Spring. There were 143 responses and the Family Nurturing Programme- developed by the Centre for Emotional health (formerly Family Links) and the SWIFT programme (for children with communication and interaction needs) were the two programmes that were most delivered by both schools and voluntary settings.

As a result, the Oxfordshire Parenting Forum are facilitating a network meeting for those settings who currently deliver, planning to deliver in the future or who are interested in creating and participating in a more joined-up way of delivering the nurturing programme.
