Developing Communication and Language in Oxfordshire



What is a 'Language Lead approach?'



The aim of a 'Language Lead' approach is to improve universal early language provision within every early years setting in Oxfordshire by establishing a named practitioner with a responsibility for communication and language.

Language Leads will receive training and support to enable them to develop their reflective practice and identify areas of strength and development in relation to early language. Language Leads are leaders and can affect change in their setting with the intention that all children reach their full potential.

The initial training programme will consist of six termly sessions on Microsoft Teams which will each have a specific focus. Language Leads will be guided by self-reflective questions and supported to develop action points bespoke to their own setting and staff. Sessions will be offered by the Early Years Advisory Team and content will be supported by other agencies supporting the project including Speech and Language Therapy and the EY SEND team.

Examples of changes led by Language Leads may include:

- improving the identification of children with SLCN
- embedding the 'WellComm Big Book of Ideas' into everyday practice
- ensuring visual signs and symbols are being used consistently
- · developing quality interactions across a staff team

Language Leads will be provided with research-based tools and new resources to help them support colleagues. They will be encouraged to recognise changes that will benefit the whole setting. Following the initial programme of six sessions in there will be an opportunity to take part in online networking.
