Looking at the data circulated at the start of Term 4 (see above), you can see that the attendance of all vulnerable groups needs attention and action. This is particularly the case for secondary-aged learners open to Early Help and subject to CP planning. Where there have been improvements compared to this time last year, they are marginal.

You can see from the table above that:

- > Primary-aged children subject to CIN and CP planning are on average absent from school the equivalent of 1 day a fortnight;
- > Secondary-aged children open to Early Help are on average absent from school for the equivalent of 3 days a fortnight;
- > Secondary-aged children subject to CIN planning are on average absent from school the equivalent of 2 days a fortnight; and
- > Secondary-aged children subject to CP planning (the most vulnerable) are on average absent from school for the equivalent of 3+ days a fortnight 12 school weeks / 3 months!

If children are not in school, how can you be sure they are safe? What can you do to make school unmissable?

We urge you to uphold your duties to consider every one of your young people with a social worker and work with the team around those young people to find a way forward.

Year 6 to 7 Transition

Secondary school allocations for Year 7 September 2025 entry are due to be announced on 1st March 2025 for children currently in Year 6 where parents/carers made an 'on-time' application to the relevant Local Authority by the 31st October 2024 deadline. If school applications haven't been made, it is essential that families are supported with this.

Please be mindful that times of change can be more unsettling for children who have already experienced adversity.

It is helpful if you can check-in with families during the first week of March to ensure that they are aware of the secondary place allocated. Please remind parents/carers to formerly accept offers within the necessary timescales along with any offers of transport. The deadline for accepting a secondary school place in Oxfordshire is 14th March 2025. Please note that children with an EHCP should already have had confirmation of their secondary school place which is typically allocated by the SEND Team by 15th February 2025. That said, a small number of EHCPs will be named on type (e.g. mainstream / specialist provision), as school consultations remain ongoing.

Spring Term is a key time for Year 11s

Please build in time to support applications to Sixth Forms, universities, colleges and apprenticeships. Go to p.5 for a list of college open days. Parents/Carers may need extra support with options. Try to take a copy of college applications that young people make and link up with their social worker. Keeping copies makes following up applications much easier, if needed.

Please liaise with your SENDCo to make sure that any Year 11s with EHCPs have a clear destination named on their plan for Post-16 education, employment or training. For mainstream colleges, once a positive consultation response has been received, children will need to apply to their chosen course, ensuring they mention having an EHCP on the application.

If you are concerned that any of your Year 11s may be at risk of not being in education, employment and training (NEET), you <u>must</u> take steps to prevent this.
